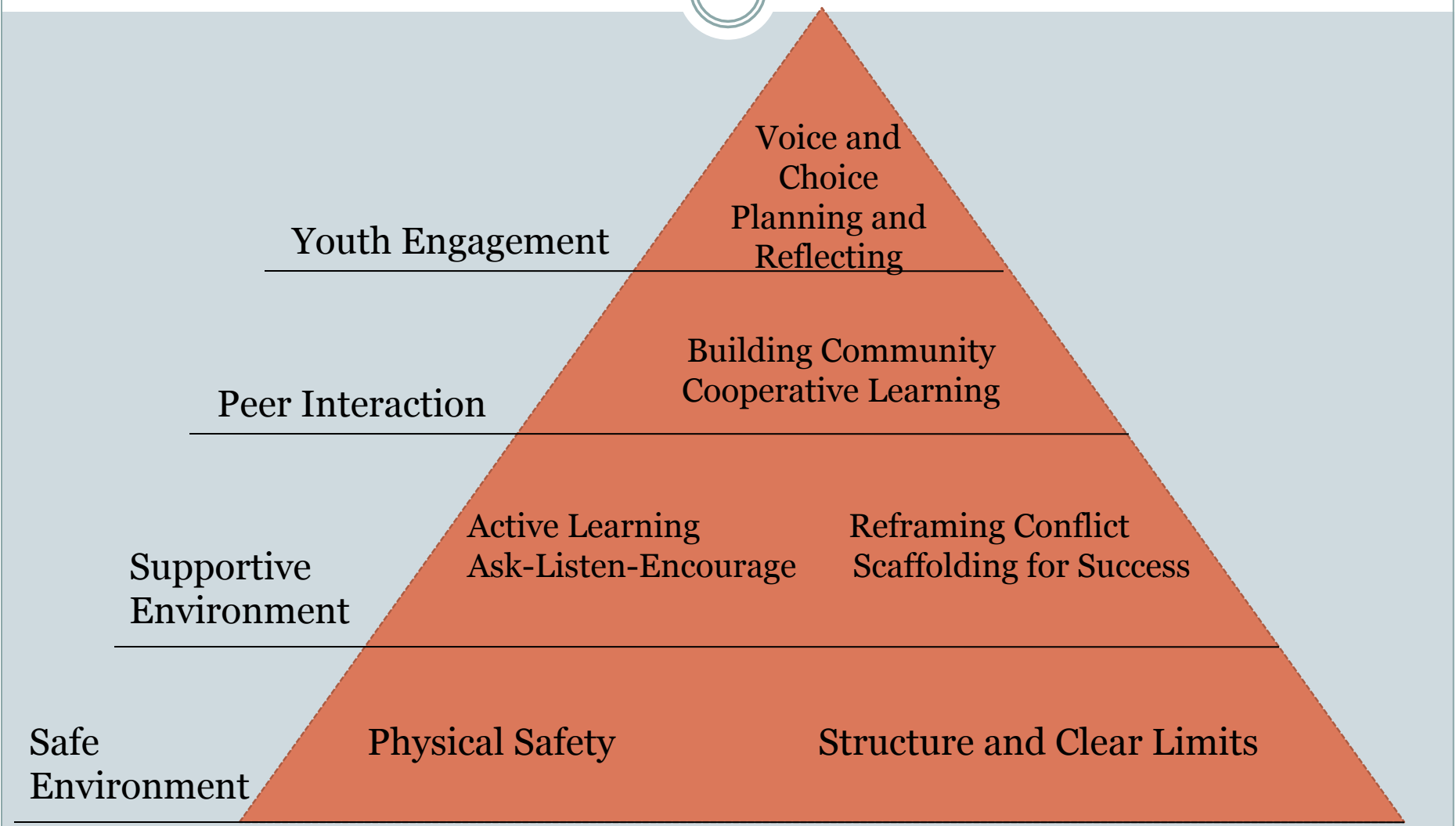
- **PODER Vision**

Program Quality: Voice and Choice



Why Provide Voice and Choice?

1. Motivation and behavior
2. Ownership in learning
3. Development of personal skills
4. Participation of adults and communities

Program Quality: Voice and Choice



Voice and Choice Guidelines

1. Provide choices about how youth spend their time
2. Involve youth in deciding what to offer
3. Give youth chances to make real decisions about the program's operation
4. Provide opportunities for leadership

Discovery Projects



What are Discovery Projects?

1. Long-term project-based activities
2. Choices based on youth interests
3. Combination of research, writing and interactive activity, along with a related field trip
4. Final showcase or production to demonstrate new skills

Discovery Projects



Why use Discovery Projects?

1. Promote positive youth development
2. Expose youth to new cultures, hobbies, career, and education pathways, etc.
3. Help students develop Illinois Learning and Core Standards in an applied setting
4. Build a new skill set and confidence
