

ISBE 21st CCLC Program Objectives

1	Participants in the program will demonstrate increased academic achievement.
2	Participants will demonstrate an increased involvement in school activities and will have opportunities in other subject areas such as technology, arts, music, theater, and sports and other recreation activities.
3	Participants in the program will demonstrate social benefits and exhibit positive behavioral changes.
4	The 21 st CCLC programs will provide opportunities for the community to be involved and will increase family involvement of the participating children.
5	Programs will provide opportunities, with priority given to all students who are lowest performing and in the greatest need of academic assistance.
6	Professional development will be offered by the programs and ISBE to meet the needs of the program, staff, and students.
7	Projects will create sustainability plans to continue the programs beyond the federal funding period.

Statewide Evaluation: Grantee Expectations

- ✓ Submit APR data and student roster information to the IIRC system
- ✓ Administer the federal teacher survey for regular program attendees
- ✓ Submit an annual survey for each grant, including teacher survey data (May-June 2021)
- ✓ Submit an annual local evaluation report for each grant (November 2021)


Brief Overview of Annual Evaluation Survey

- Each grantee must complete an annual evaluation survey.
- Grantees submit one survey per grant.
- The surveys asks grantees to report on:
 - 1. Grant-level program implementation information
 - 2. Site-specific information, including APR Teacher Survey Data
- This survey covers programming conducted between July 1st, 2020 June 30th, 2021 (Summer 2020 & School Year 2020-21)

Your surveys are due on June 30th, 2021!!!

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





Updates to the local evaluation report template



We know that this year was challenging and hard!

 The local evaluation report template has been updated to include suggestions for sharing the impact of COVID-19 on your program.

Due November 30th For July 2020-June 2021

• Given that many grantees been operating for <5 years, we've changed the student attendance and demographic tables to include only *the past three years* to highlight changes and trends.

Strategies for your local evaluation report

- Highlight the ways that your program innovated to reach and serve your students and their families.
- Share your successes in reaching and retaining students in needs.
- Describe how staff developed new skills.
- Include qualitative data. For many programs, this year was about quality, not quantity.

Possible Outcomes:

- Retention and re-engagement of students
- Providing new kinds activities to connect with and engage students
- Parent and family engagement
- SEL and student support
- New staff skills and professional learning

Shift from challenges to lessons learned

What did you learn that you might bring with you into next year? What we've heard from grantees...

- Virtual parent programming
- Increasing communication with students and families via a phone call or texts
- Mix of virtual and in-person options for students
- New ways to track attendance
- New collaborations with outside providers to offer enrichment programming/activities
- Increasing student voice and input in program offerings



Looking ahead to next year...



What will your new normal look like? Plan time to talk with your evaluator to share plans and goals for the year, including changes to schedules and activities.



Clarify data collection. How will you collect data given the changes to GPRA (student program attendance, school day attendance, GPAs, etc.).



The statewide evaluation team will work with ISBE and the data warehouse team to revise instruments and continue to reduce data collection burden for you.
